#### **Reflection & Discussion Questions**

## When we feel safe to share our story, we find ourselves in God's story God loves our stories because in them, He is revealed.

### Read and discuss Mark 9:14-29 (NTE)

- <sup>14</sup> The four of them made their way back to the other disciples. There they saw a large crowd surrounding them, and legal experts arguing with them. <sup>15</sup> As soon as the crowd saw Jesus they were astounded, and they all ran up to greet him.
- <sup>16</sup> 'What's all the fuss about?' he asked. <sup>17</sup> 'Teacher,' said someone from the crowd, 'I brought my son to you. He's got a spirit that stops him speaking. <sup>18</sup> Whenever it takes hold of him it throws him on the ground; he foams at the mouth, and grinds his teeth, and goes rigid. I spoke to your disciples about casting it out, but they couldn't.'
- <sup>19</sup> 'You unbelieving generation!' replied Jesus. 'How much longer must I be with you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring the boy to me.'
- <sup>20</sup> They brought him to him. When the spirit saw Jesus, it immediately threw the boy into a convulsion, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth.
- <sup>21</sup> 'How long has it been like this with him?' asked Jesus.
- 'Since childhood,' replied the man. <sup>22</sup> 'Often it even throws him into fire or water to kill him. But if you can do anything . . . please, please help us! Have pity on us!'
- <sup>23</sup> 'What d'you mean, "If you can"?' said Jesus. 'Everything is possible to someone who believes.'
- <sup>24</sup> At this the father gave a great shout. 'I do believe!' he roared. 'Help me in my unbelief!'
- <sup>25</sup> Jesus saw that the crowd was getting bigger by the minute. He scolded the unclean spirit: 'Speechless and deaf spirit,' he said, 'I command you come out of him, and never go back again!'
- <sup>26</sup> The spirit yelled, gave the boy a huge convulsion, and came out. The boy seemed to be dead; in fact, several people did say 'He's dead!' <sup>27</sup> But Jesus took him by the hand and helped him to his feet, and he stood up.
- <sup>28</sup> 'Why couldn't we cast it out?' asked his disciples, once they were back in the house by themselves.
- <sup>29</sup> 'This sort', replied Jesus, 'can only be cast out by prayer.'
