Jonah and others like him are trusting, stable, supportive and easily able to see many perspectives

He could be complacent, indecisive, stubborn and tried to avoid conflict at all costs.

Jonah and others like him could greatly benefit from prayer, scripture reading and leaning into this verse

Ephesians 4:14-15 (Message)

No prolonged infancies among us, please. We'll not tolerate babes in the woods, small children who are an easy mark for impostors. God wants us to grow up, to know the **whole** truth and tell it in love—like Christ in everything.

- *What does this verse say to you? How could it be helpful to someone like Jonah?
- *What would it mean for you to 'grow up'?

People like Jonah need us to remind them their presence makes a difference and they are up to the task

- *What is great and helpful about having someone like Jonah at the table?
- *What can be frustrating about sitting with him?

Peter – focused on freedom and adventure
Paul – focused on doing good and being good
Joseph – focused on the desire to be unique
Rebekah – focused on loyalty and security
Jacob – focused on success and accomplishments
Deborah – focused on power and justice
Martha – focused on helping and being indispensable
Nicodemus – focused on knowledge and being right
Jonah – focused on peace and harmony

- *What conflicts could arise between a Jonah type and some of these others?
- *How could this type benefit one of the other personalities we've talked about?
