## **Reflection & Discussion Questions**

## There is enormous pressure in our culture to take a stand and say something about an issue

The news cycle and social media drive the thought life of so many of us.

- \*What issues of the day do you feel pressure to state your opinion on?
- \*Does giving our opinion about something fool us into believing we are making a difference?

# We are blessed not in studying the Word of God but in the doing of it It is not the learning, but the living.

Read and discuss James 1:22-25(ESV)

<sup>22</sup> But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. <sup>23</sup> For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. <sup>24</sup> For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. <sup>25</sup> But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

- \*What do these verses tell us about an active faith?
- \*When have you been blessed by doing the word of God?
- \*James doesn't say we should be doers only, just not hearers only. How do these things work in tandem?

#### Read and discuss James 1:26-27(ESV)

<sup>26</sup> If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. <sup>27</sup> Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.

\*What is James calling us to here? What is hard to hear or challenging in these verses?

\*How can our heart be deceived by what we think is faith?

#### Spirituality is worthless unless you:

**Control what you say** – our words should not just come out of our mouths but instead serve the Kingdom

**Visit those who are afflicted** – not talking about them, but face to face, loving them well **Resist being stained by the world** – engaging in the world without buying into its mindset

- \*How have you seen the church in America not be anchored in these things? How have you gotten caught up?
- \*How do you seek to keep control of your tongue? What has practically worked for you?
- \*What does it look like to visit the afflicted in your life?
- \*How do you wade into the mess of the world without becoming a mess?

Song for reflection More Like lesus by Passion

\*Visio divina – a thoughtful and slow way of contemplating a visual prompt like a piece of art, photograph or image and inviting God to speak to you through it. First, focus on the detail that your eyes are drawn to right away – keep focus there and pay attention to what thoughts and emotions you are having. Then, look at the entire image and consider it as a whole, being aware of thoughts, questions and emotions it provokes. End in silence and prayer, considering your experience and anything you feel called to respond to.
