#### Faith is waiting

Waiting is a really big part of being the people of God.
Read and discuss Habakkuk 2:1-4(NIV)
In addition, read Romans 1:17; Galatians 3:11; and Hebrews 10:38
I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts;
I will look to see what he will say to me, and what answer I am to give to this complaint.
<sup>2</sup> Then the LORD replied:
<sup>3</sup> For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false.
Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay.

"Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it. <sup>4</sup> "See, the enemy is puffed up; his desires are not upright but the righteous person will live by his faithfulness—

\*What do you see about people in these passages? About God? \*What do they say about waiting and how it's connected to faith? \*Do they invite you to do, think, or change anything in your live? What questions are prompted in you?

## Waiting is about learning to think about time like He does

Waiting with God does something good to our soul.

\*Why would waiting with God be formational? Has waiting formed you? \*When have you seen His presence in your waiting? What hope does Habakkuk's experience give you?
