### **Reflection & Discussion Questions**

#### **We begin to see the fruit of Habakkuk's wrestling with God**

He has been incredibly shaped by this deep experience.

Read and discuss Habakkuk 3:1-2(ESV)

*O Lord, I have heard the report of you,  
and your work, O Lord, do I fear.*

*In the midst of the years revive it;  
in the midst of the years make it known;  
in wrath remember mercy.*

\*What is Habakkuk asking of God here? What is he *not* asking?

\*What do these verses show how Habakkuk has been shaped?

#### **Habakkuk remembers who God has been and praises who He will continue to be**

Remembering gives us hope in the midst of difficulties and waiting.

\*Is there a time that questioning and doubting revealed God's true character to you?

\*How does remembering what God has done through the ages, and in your own life, fuel hope and strengthen relationship?

#### **Habakkuk's wrestling preceded his worship**

Read and discuss Habakkuk 3:16-19 (ESV)

*I hear, and my body trembles;*

*my lips quiver at the sound;*

*rottenness enters into my bones;*

*my legs tremble beneath me.*

*Yet I will quietly wait for the day of trouble  
to come upon people who invade us.*

*<sup>17</sup> Though the fig tree should not blossom,*

*nor fruit be on the vines,*

*the produce of the olive fail*

*and the fields yield no food,*

*the flock be cut off from the fold*

*and there be no herd in the stalls,*

*<sup>18</sup> yet I will rejoice in the Lord;*

*I will take joy in the God of my salvation.*

*<sup>19</sup> God, the Lord, is my strength;*

*he makes my feet like the deer's;*

*he makes me tread on my high places.*

\*How does Habakkuk wrestle in way that seeks strengthened relationship?

\*How has worship helped you in a difficult time?

\*Is there anything that you are wrestling through with God right now? How can Habakkuk's experience be a guide to you?
