We begin to see the fruit of Habakkuk's wrestling with God

Read and discuss Habakkuk 3:1-2(ESV) O Lord, I have heard the report of you, and your work, O Lord, do I fear. In the midst of the years revive it; in the midst of the years make it known; in wrath remember mercy.

*What is Habakkuk asking of God here? What is he not asking?

Habakkuk remembers who God has been and praises who He will continue to be

Remembering gives us hope in the midst of difficulties and waiting.

*Is there a time that questioning and doubting revealed God's true character to you?

Habakkuk's wrestling preceded his worship

Read and discuss Habakkuk 3:16-19 (ESV)

I hear, and my body trembles; my lips quiver at the sound; rottenness enters into my bones; my legs tremble beneath me.

Yet I will quietly wait for the day of trouble to come upon people who invade us.

17 Though the fig tree should not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail

and the fields yield no food, the flock be cut off from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, ¹⁸ yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will take joy in the God of my salvation. ¹⁹ God, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the deer's; he makes me tread on my high places.
