### Radical Encounters – The Desperate Woman

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#### **Reflection & Discussion Questions**

# The woman was desperate for the healing of her body

Read and discuss Mark 5:21-34 (NIV)

<sup>21</sup> When Jesus had again crossed over by boat to the other side of the lake, a large crowd gathered around him while he was by the lake. <sup>22</sup> Then one of the synagogue leaders, named Jairus, came, and when he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet. <sup>23</sup> He pleaded earnestly with him, "My little daughter is dying. Please come and put your hands on her so that she will be healed and live." <sup>24</sup> So Jesus went with him.

A large crowd followed and pressed around him. <sup>25</sup> And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. <sup>26</sup> She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors and had spent all she had, yet instead of getting better she grew worse. <sup>27</sup> When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, <sup>28</sup> because she thought, "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed." <sup>29</sup> Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering.

- <sup>30</sup> At once Jesus realized that power had gone out from him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my clothes?"
- <sup>31</sup> "You see the people crowding against you," his disciples answered, "and yet you can ask, 'Who touched me?'" <sup>32</sup> But Jesus kept looking around to see who had done it. <sup>33</sup> Then the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell at his feet and, trembling with fear, told him the whole truth. <sup>34</sup> He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."
- \*What is surprising or interesting about this encounter?
- \*What were the consequences of this woman's illness for her?
- \*Is there something you are desperate for? What are the consequences of your desperation?

#### Jesus does not mistake her desperation

He sees her grasping as a definitive act of faith.

- \*How do you see faith in the woman's actions?
- \*What is lesus' response?
- \*What does this radical encounter teach us? Can you find hope for your desperation in this encounter?

# Jesus didn't come just to make people 'better'. He came to make them 'closer'

Healings were a grand restoration of those on the outside looking in.

- \*How did the healing of the woman do more than help her physically?
- \*What does this encounter show us about the way we label, categorize or ignore people?
- \*What would it look like if our desperation was for loving Jesus' way?
- \*What do you sense the Spirit is telling you?
