#### **Reflection & Discussion Questions**

#### Many of us grew up hearing Bible stories in Sunday School

A lot of these stories were really intense and kind of awful.

\*If you grew up around the Bible, what stories stand out to you from childhood? Were the stories you learned 'sanitized' in some way?

\*Why do you think these stories would be told to kids?

### These stories are meaningful for us as God's people

They reveal things about Him and about humans that are important for us to understand.

\*What are some important questions to keep in mind as we read these stories?

## The Genesis flood story is not about meteorology, geology, or zoology- it is about theology

Read and discuss Genesis 6:9-14(NIV) [Consider reading chapters 6-8]

<sup>9</sup> This is the account of Noah and his family.

Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God. <sup>10</sup> Noah had three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth.

<sup>11</sup> Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. <sup>12</sup> God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. <sup>13</sup> So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. <sup>14</sup> So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out.

\*What seems to be the reason for the flood?

\*What does the whole Noah story tell us about God? What does it reveal about the heart of the God we worship?

\*Why is this a story worth telling? What seems to be the author's intent?

#### Violence is a huge deal to God

The people of God should not be violent people.

Read and discuss Genesis 9:6 (NIV)

6 "Whoever sheds human blood, by humans shall their blood be shed; for in the image of God has God made mankind.

\*Why is violence such an issue for God? What happens to humans involved in violence?

\*Why would God's opposition to violence not automatically mean pacifism?

## The ark teaches us that even in His grief God has grace

It is His nature to redeem and recreate the things He loves.

\*How does this flood story teach us about grace?

\*How is He redeeming and recreating you? What is hard or discouraging about this process?

\*What is the Spirit saying to you about embracing the re-creation He is doing in you?
