## 2 Timothy: What Matters Most

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#### Discussion and Reflection Guide

### Paul encourages Timothy not to argue about unimportant things

Read and discuss 2 Timothy 2:14 (NIV)

<sup>14</sup> Keep reminding God's people of these things. Warn them before God against quarreling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen.

\*Do you have an example of a time that you got caught up in a quarrel of no value? Why did it seem important at the time?

\*How do these types of arguments 'ruin those who listen'?

# Word-wars put the focus on the victory of the speaker, not the victory of the truth Read and discuss 2 Timothy 2:15-18 (NIV)

<sup>15</sup> Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. <sup>16</sup> Avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly. <sup>17</sup> Their teaching will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, <sup>18</sup> who have departed from the truth. They say that the resurrection has already taken place, and they destroy the faith of some.

\*What can this passage show us about engaging with people?

\*How would you describe what it means to 'correctly handle the word of truth'?

### The invitation is to be used by God

Read and discuss 2 Timothy 2:19-21 (NIV)

<sup>19</sup> Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are his," and, "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness."

<sup>20</sup> In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for special purposes and some for common use. <sup>21</sup> Those who cleanse themselves from the latter will be instruments for special purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work.

\*How do you sense the Spirit is inviting you to be used – prepared to do good work?

## Read and discuss 2 Timothy 2:22-26 (NIV)

<sup>22</sup> Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. <sup>23</sup> Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. <sup>24</sup> And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. <sup>25</sup> Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, <sup>26</sup> and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.

- \*What does it look like to engage rather than enrage?
- \*Where do you sense the Holy Spirit calling you to flee arguing? To pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace?
