# People will give you reasons to give up on them - but don't

Read and discuss 2 Timothy 4:9-11(NIV)

<sup>9</sup> Do your best to come to me quickly, <sup>10</sup> for Demas, because he loved this world, has deserted me and has gone to Thessalonica. Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus to Dalmatia. <sup>11</sup> Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, because he is helpful to me in my ministry.

\*How have relational pain, forgiveness, and restoration been a part of serving God for you?

\*Have you given up in some way? Pushing people away or hiding in cynicism?

\*What keeps you engaged? How can we keep ourselves open to relationships even when we get hurt?

## God does not bypass humans when He does His work on earth

Read and discuss 2 Timothy 4:12-13 (NIV)

<sup>12</sup> I sent Tychicus to Ephesus. <sup>13</sup> When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, and my scrolls, especially the parchments.

\*Where have you seen room for your own humanness in your walk with God?

\*Are there areas you have tried to delete or segregate as an obstacle to spirituality?

\*What does it mean that humanness is sewn into the spiritual?

# The context of the New Testament is a diverse community who have become a family Read and discuss 2 Timothy 4:14-22 (NIV)

<sup>14</sup> Alexander the metalworker did me a great deal of harm. The Lord will repay him for what he has done. <sup>15</sup> You too should be on your guard against him, because he strongly opposed our message. <sup>16</sup> At my first defense, no one came to my support, but everyone deserted me. May it not be held against them. <sup>17</sup> But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was delivered from the lion's mouth. <sup>18</sup> The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and will bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

<sup>19</sup> Greet Priscilla and Aquila and the household of Onesiphorus. <sup>20</sup> Erastus stayed in Corinth, and I left Trophimus sick in Miletus. <sup>21</sup> Do your best to get here before winter. Eubulus greets you, and so do Pudens, Linus, Claudia and all the brothers and sisters. <sup>22</sup> The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you all.
